## **MEET THE NEIGHBOURS**

Been wondering what will happen in the new early childhood hub next door?

The centre includes: 105 long day care places per day. For 0 to 2 year olds - 2 rooms with 12 places each; For 2 to 3 year olds - 3 rooms with 16 places each; and for 3 to 5 year olds - 1 room with 33 places. There will be 33 places per day for 4 year old sessional preschool.

There's a shared outdoor play space for the long day care and sessional preschool programmes (you can see it from the back and it's pretty special) and there's a playgroup room with an outdoor play space.

There are two Maternal Child Health offices and an allied health consulting suite, plus a kitchen and dining area for children, a feeding room and pram storage.

From the Bowls Club point of view, there's a community notice board and scrolling television screens where we will be able to promote the club and events, and we are investigating whether we can create a link with the hub's clients by establishing the Bowls Vic "Bowling with Babies" programme at the club.

The hub starts becoming active as of April 24.

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## **"POLICEMEN"**

At it's last meeting, the Board again expressed concern about the activities of self-appointed "policemen"—members who, whether in positions of authority or not, are chastising and criticising fellow members and visitors, for what these "policemen" believe to be breaches of rules or etiquette. Frequently these "policemen" are being pedantic and/or intolerant, outdated in their views, or in many cases simply wrong.

These actions drive away members and put off new members.

The Board notes that under Section 15e of our constitution that if it believes actions of a member are detrimental to the club, then the Board has the power to refuse to renew memberships.

**Remember that the club motto is** <u>*"Friendship through Bowls."*</u> What we need is a friendly attitude, not a confrontational one.

## **SMOKING POLICY**

The club's new smoking policy, details of which are posted on notice boards, came into effect on April 1. Smoking is confined to clearly delineated areas, on the veranda, in the far left hand corner of No 1 green, the far right hand corner of No 2 green, at the back of the breezeway near the old shed, and on the area above No 1 green behind the retaining wall. Full details are on maps and notices. Penalties will apply to members who fail to adhere to the policy. In the first instance, they will be suspended for one week and for a recurring breach, four weeks. Details of how this works are spelt out in the notices.

Would you know what to do if a member of your bowling team, friend or your partner suddenly collapsed? We know that time is of the essence when someone collapses. The quicker we can assist them and get medical help the better chance of survival they have.

Our sponsor **Healthguard First Aid** is looking to run a fully accredited first aid course for members of the Bayswater Bowls Club at a reduced rate. Learn all the skills to manage any emergency until the arrival of an ambulance.

Course topics include:

- · Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)
- Medical emergencies
- Trauma and bleeding management
- · Care of the unconscious casualty

The first aid course is conducted by qualified ambulance paramedics.

The course is a fast track course which requires the completion of a workbook prior to commencing the practical components of the course. The course is delivered over 6 hours either in one day or two 3 hour sessions.
