VALE RON HURLEY

T is with deep regret that the club records the passing of our foundation member, inaugural president and life member, **Ron Hurley**, at the age of 73, after receiving severe head injuries in a fall at Southern Cross station while leaving a match involving his beloved Richmond Football Club.

Ron was involved in the club for 37 years—attending the first ever public meeting that raised the possibility of a bowls club being formed in Bayswater, where he was the second person to sign up for membership behind his father Bill. Ron was a driving force behind the formation and building of the club which he served faithfully in many capacities, including seven years as president, eight years as treasurer/finance director, and four years as executive secretary.

He also served the Knox Community in many volunteer capacities over many years, including kindergarten and school committees, scouts, cricket, football and netball clubs, frequently, because of his background in banking, acting as treasurer for these organisations.

It was fitting therefore that the Board agreed to a suggestion by member John Rouse, himself also heavily involved in that early phase, that there should be a permanent recognition of Ron's services and it was agreed that the No 2 green—the first green to be built—should named **The Ron Hurley Memorial Green**.

This marker was unveiled at a dedication ceremony on August 14, attended by members of Ron's family, Knox Mayor Jake Keogh and a large representation of club members.

Our condolences are offered to his wife of 54 years, Julie, sons Cameron and Shaun (the three of them also having been members of the club at times), daughters Joanne and Lauren and his 11 grandchildren.

We would also like to pay tribute to Ron's brother Leo, a 30-year member of the club who had moved to Echuca in recent years and who passed away only two weeks before Ron's accident.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS

We've been in discussions with the Early Childhood Hub about such things as the "Bowling with Babies" initiative of BowlsVic, and other possible events or links that we might try.

Together with this and the prospect of having younger people taking part in our "raise money for your club" challenge, then we need as many people as possible to have Working with Children Checks. This is a simple process that takes about ten minutes online, where you'll need to supply identity details such as passport, driver's licence or Medicare cards. Describe yourself as a volunteer coach with Bayswater Bowls Club, and that makes it free. When cleared, you'll get an email to take to the post office where you get your photograph taken. Simple.

If you are not a computer person, then we can do it with you on the club computer.

We also need to know which members already have a check. Talk to Alistair.

"Access Pathway" and other projects

As you know, Knox Council has agreed to construct an "access pathway" (disability or wheelchair ramp) which will lead from the front car park, in front to the existing disabled parking spots, in a zigzag to reach the bank near the bottom of the steps. Designs have yet to be finalised and a contractor appointed, but early indications are that work will commence in December with a view to finishing the project in January.

We have also obtained funding towards an upgrade of the kitchen, and also towards our security system. More of that later.

MEMBERS DRAW

Thursdays at 6.30pm is **THE** time to be at the club, because that's when a member's draw will be held, commencing the first Thursday in September. That's the 5th. The weekly prize is \$50, but you have to be at the club in person when it is drawn to collect the money. If not won it will continue to jackpot at the rate of \$50 per week until it goes off.

So come along to happy hour, have a bit of practice, get involved with corporate bowls, or whatever. Just be there.
