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CLUB OVERHAUL

Following circulation of a discussion paper and a meeting of members, it has been agreed that we should now proceed with changes to our constitution and by-laws so that in future the club can be overseen by one single committee, to make the running of the club more streamlined and efficient and more in line with contemporary practices.

The proposal is that the new look Board/Committee of Management, will be:

President Vice President

Secretary

Assistant Secretary

Treasurer

2 x Elected Directors

2x Appointed Directors

The Greens Director and Bowls Coordinator will be appointed by the elected Board, and they will then become the two appointed directors.

It is envisaged that the President, Secretary and Treasurer will be elected for rotating three year terms, as is the present case, while the others will be elected annually. The duties of the Vic President and the Assistant Secretary would primarily focus on the Bowls side of things.

The next step will be a virtual total re-write of our constitution and by-laws, a lengthy and daunting task, where the opportunity will be taken to clean up and modernise whatever other matters we can. That will then go to a special general meeting of members for their approval, after which it will have to be ratified by the Department of Justice, since we are an incorporated association and the Liquor Control Authorities.
