### WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER

I'm not going to mince words – the club is going through extremely trying times at the moment, particularly as regards pennant, all flowing on from the lifting of covid restrictions, where there continues to be conflicting and complex information.

Without going into all the details (happy to on a one-to-one basis), which included feed-back from our own members, the Board decided that the club's policy should be **"no-vax, no-play"** for members and visitors, a decision that is backed by Knox Council, the owner of our land, and is in line with many clubs in our region.

One of the reasons for this is that the majority of our members, because of age or health issues, are in a vulnerable category, and also, after taking surveys, only one in seven of members were prepared to play against unvaccinated players.

We had two unvaccinated players that we were not prepared to select and a number of players, objecting to this decision, decided to move on.

This, in turn, led to issues in selecting teams, and also left gaps on selection and the Board. (see Old News.)

It is a situation we have to first work through before we can get back to moving the club forward.

The only way to do this is for all members to be accepting of the situation, and to "go with the flow" particularly regarding selection. In these times we should be thinking of the club ahead of ourselves. I know there are always people who don't really think this way, but it's the quickest way to resolve this issue.

(To this end, reference to playing north-south for pennant practice refers to Thursday afternoon and any other time when practice is scheduled. Coming up on a Monday afternoon or a Friday morning, even if you are playing pennant on the Tuesday or Saturday, is NOT "pennant practice" in this context.
