COVID LOCKDOWN

Due to the latest Covid lockdown, the Club is in total lockdown. Both Club House and greens are closed.

Providing restrictions are lifted as announced on Wednesday at 11:59 pm, the Club should be open on Thursday, Feb. 18. The lockdown will affect the timing of selection of teams for Saturday pennant so you will need to check the website for team listings after the club reopens. They will be posted as soon as possible.

RECRUITMENT

We are not unique in this regard, especially emerging from Covid which changed people's habits, but we are very keen to recruit new members, and we are asking if you can do your bit in this regard. Potential new bowlers can come along to Friday Barefoot bowls, or you can introduce them to the game in a more private manner. Show them how it is done, and if they are interested, offer them free tuition through one of the club coaches. Take them through the club. Tell them what we do.

However, we are also anxious to recruit experienced bowlers so have your "sales pitch" about our ambitious plans ready for them. We offer free membership for the first year, free shirt, and we will pay their transfer fee.

PHONE CONTACT

Because a telephone call is still often the primary method of contacting the club, we have replaced the old worn-out answering system which was causing problems, with a new one, and also purchased a mobile phone for use by the "duty officer" – one of the Board members working on a roster basis.

The new message on the phone will encourage callers (specifically membership or function booking enquires) to call the duty officer as a first option. A system has been instigated to ensure that the answering machine is checked for messages on a systematic basis, by checking remotely using the mobile.
