AGM MAY 1 2022 Executive report

ELL, it's been another eventful year, as you'll soon hear, and I'd like to thank my fellow Board Members for their efforts in ensuring that the club continued not only to run as smoothly as possible in the circumstances but actually continue to move forward: John Garrity, secretary; John Corn, Treasurer, Barb Keenan, assistant secretary, Wally Gear and Karen Barton as elected members, and the appointees John Rouse as Green Director and Doug Clarke as Bowls Director.

It has been, of course, another year where covid had a huge impact, but we were able to ride out the lockdowns fairly well, and the loss of income was alleviated by Government grants, but the biggest impact of all came when we were able to re-open and pennant resumed. We were full of hope for the forthcoming season, having appointed a head coach, who had devised a detailed plan, and recruited experience bowlers, but these hopes were dashed because of the extremely confusing and often contradictory rulings by the State Government, Bowls Victoria and Knox Council as lockdown was eased.. Like many other clubs, we expressed our views strongly with Bowls Victoria about how they were handling the return to play rules.

While those players who decided not to get vaccinated (including our coach Zac Woning) accepted the club's decision that we would play only double-vaccinated players, a number of others did not, including our vice-president, Tyson McCamley, and decided to walk out on the

club, leaving a huge gap in our playing numbers, which meant we were often unable to field complete teams. While one mid-week team managed to get into finals, everyone else struggled and relegations resulted. However, we now have a large number of new and enthusiastic bowlers in our ranks, and hopefully we can redress this next season.

Since it was not specifically required under our constitution, the Board decided not to fill the vacant position of Vice President, but shared his responsibilities among other directors, and I'd also like to thank Andy Pryor who put his hand up to become heavily involved in Masters and Apprentices and Club Championships. And congratulations to all our champions. In a covid free environment we may be able to re-schedule these events in future to avoid delays in completing games.

Although we were able to get back out on the greens, co-vid continued to impact on the club in other ways. We found, for example, that people seemed reluctant to remain at the club and mingle after games, and as a result there was a downturn in bar sales, and we didn't have the numbers to get Joker Poker off the ground. Numbers made the food van unviable. Bookings for functions have not returned to pre-covid levels, and a number of bookings were cancelled when participants were forced into isolation. We also lost sponsors whose businesses were hit. And we had to cancel a major Grand Final Eve tournament.

Nevertheless, as you'll hear from the Treasurer, the finances of the club remain sound.

And projects did get completed. The new car park and accessibility ramp was completed, plantings have been made and a sprinkler system installed, and our new welcoming board was put up. As you know, we received a grant for the installation of a new front gate and fencing, which should have been completed by now but was another thing impacted by covid because of staff shortages and supply issues. Likewise, we have other projects in the pipeline where we are having issues in getting tradespeople.

Work has begun though, on the installation of solar panels for which we received a State Government grant of \$20,000, with us tipping in another \$20,000 from our SIBC funds. The new switchboard in in place, and the solar panel contractors have only to complete the necessary paperwork before proceeding. We actually scored a covid bonus on this one, supply issues meaning we will get a better panel installed for the same price. The project will save the club approximately \$6,000 a year in electricity bills. (continued on page 3)

SIBC funds also enabled us to provide shirts of a new design to members free of charge.

We received a grant that enabled us to purchase special colourful barefoot bowls, and also paid for a leaflet drop to encourage people to take up bowls post-covid, and we did, in fact, gain members as a result. We ran a Rookie Rollers program for Bayswater West Primary School (again covid disrupted!) and developed a programme aimed at secondary schools, which unfortunately has received little response.

Looking forward, it is essential that we continue to promote our club to the local community, with the aim of attracting both members and event bookings, which brings me to the topic of member participation (or volunteers!). We must thank those members who devote their time to helping around the club in so many ways, gardening, greens maintenance, building maintenance, the kitchen, the bar, the barbecue, cleaning, barefoot bowls. There's always something that needs to be done, and thanks to those who put their hands up to do it.

We'll continue to need such people in the future, and it needn't be at an organised time or event. One task that faces us, for example, is painting the shelters and other outdoor equipment. That can be done at any time ... an hour here or there whenever it's convenient to you. Come in, access that paint, the brushes and other equipment and go for it. (See John Rouse or John Corn and they'll tell what needs to be done and where things are.)

We need to keep the place looking nice so that people are happy coming here, and we also need to get out and spread the word. So please think about what you can do and offer your services.

We've been working to a fairly organised plan, but covid has kept getting in the way. Let's hope that's behind us, and we can have a covid-free annual report next year!
