On behalf of the Saturday selectors I would like to wish all of our pennant players success and good bowling for the coming season.

Our two division 2 sides will be selected to attempt to give our club the best advantage and possible wins over the season.

Our 3rd side will have players rotated to be as fair as possible for all players. Hopefully players not selected for pennant on most occasions will be able to compete against similar players from Heatherdale. On other occasions games will be organised amongst ourselves and looking after the barbecue.

We are also looking into ways to have rink of the week, player of the year and best club person.

It is essential that we back up our senior club coach with as many as possible members attending training. Scoring Shots

Skips and 3rds, when scoring shots, be sure not to over score players. The result could be a player being promoted to a higher side unduly and that side being beaten.

Accuracy in scoring is paramount. A mat length is under a mat length from where the skip wants the bowl to finish. A metre is under a metre from where the skip wants the bowl to finish. Three points for under a mat length. One point for under one metre.

Again we as selectors wish all pennant players success and good bowling for the coming season.
